MENTAL ILLNESS, RACE, ETHNICITY, AND GENDER THROUGH LITERATURE

According to the United States National Institute of Mental Health and Canada's Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, approximately 20 percent of adults in the United States and Canada live with a mental illness. And yet the biases and misperceptions surrounding mental illness remain pervasive, destructive, and at times deadly. At particular risk are individuals already marginalized by society because of their ethnicity, race, immigration status, gender, sexuality, socioeconomic status and other factors. In this open class, we'll be discussing these dynamics as they relate to the mental wellbeing of Black women in the United States and Indigenous women in Canada, focusing on Meri Nana-Ama Danquah's memoir *Willow Weep for Me: A Black Woman's Journey through Depression* and Terese Marie Mailhot's memoir *Heart Berries* as challenges to conventional understandings of mental illness.

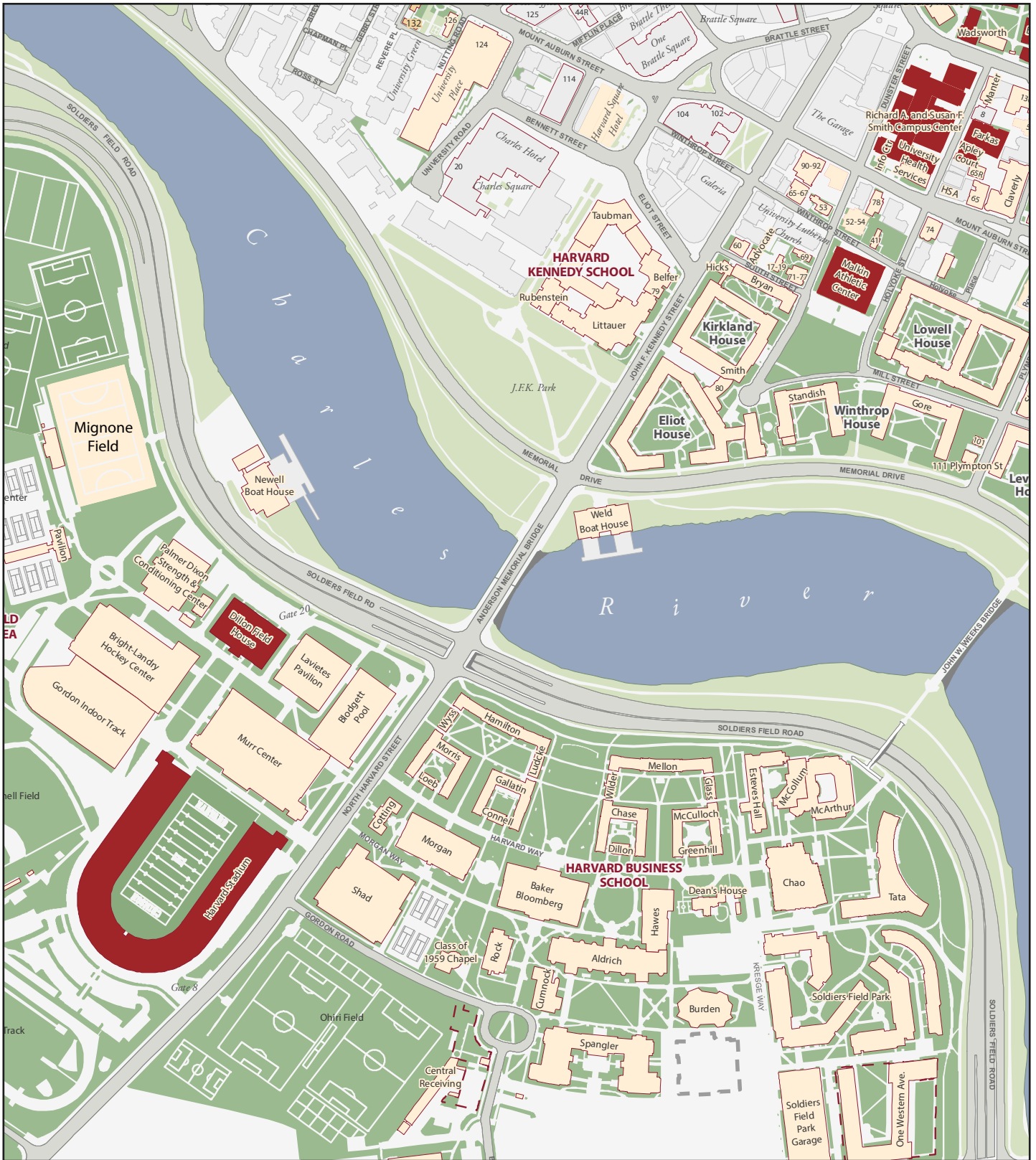
